The 636th meeting of the Long Island Water Conference was held on Monday March 27, 2017 at the Woodbury Country Club, Woodbury, N.Y. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Stan Carey at 7:20 p.m.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

PROGRAM

Chairman Carey introduced Mr. Nir Naveh from Hydrosipin, the evening's program speaker.

The program for the evening was Use of Hydro-Electric Power Generators in Water Systems.

Mr. Naveh spoke about Hydrosipin, which produces micro energy from generators within water pipelines. The patented wet generator installed in pipelines creates AC energy, without creating significant head loss. The generators are capable of supplying energy for PRV's, district metering areas, data loggers and water quality monitoring systems.

Chairman Carey thanked Mr. Naveh for his program.

Drinking Water Standards Committee - Paul Ponturo

Mr. Ponturo reported the following:

On March 1, 2017, the AWWA sent out a regulatory advisory about the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act (WIIN) and a plan should be developed by June 14, 2017. Two significant items of note are:

- 1- The Government passed and allocated approximated \$100 million for lead service line replacement, but it needs residential declaration for emergency. This would currently only include Flint Michigan.
- 2- There will be a 24 hour notification for lead violations above the 15 ppb action level. The current notification is 30-60 days. The EPA also extended notification requirements for samples taken by outside agencies other than water suppliers. It is the water supplier's responsibility to educate customers.

Education Committee - Joe Baier

Mr. Baier reported that 86 operators attended the Chemical safety and water main repair workshop in the Garden City Park Firehouse on Thursday, March 16. Thank you to Bob Holzmacher and Paul Ponturo for their presentations.

The next workshop will be held at the Bay Shore Firehouse on Wednesday, April 19th. The topic will be Resin Technology and UV.

The next NYSAWWA workshop on Dam Safety will be held on Thursday, March 20th, at Dvirka and Bartilucci, Woodbury.
